
Dear Mr. Presogna:

Thank you for sending us your manuscript titled "Mercantilism." Unfortunately, our space limitations prevent us from accepting many articles we would like and, regrettably, we will not be able to publish your article.

For future reference, we tend to publish feature articles of 2,500 to 5,000 words on various issues of public policy, conservative philosophy and theory, and citizenship. We also have a number of departments containing shorter articles of 800 to 1,500 words. We are particularly keen on profiles of people or programs that demonstrate innovative private-sector or local government approaches to social issues like crime, welfare dependency, urban decay, joblessness, and the deterioration of values and the American family--approaches that can be applied elsewhere.

We rarely publish unsolicited manuscripts. Should you think of an idea that you believe would interest us, I suggest you write to me, Joe Loconte, or Adam Meyerson before you proceed. This would give us a chance to accept or decline the idea, or suggest how you might shape it to accommodate our needs.
